Dear Parents/Guardians,

Summer Reading has officially started! At Cathedral we believe that summer is a crucial time to keep our students engaged in learning and to prevent the "summer slide". The summer slide can be avoided by ensuring that children are as engaged as possible in whatever they choose to read—just as long as they are reading every day!

Students entering 3rd through 5th grades are required to read at least FIVE books:

- ONE required read (see list below).
- FOUR other books of their choice (they should refer to the Choice Board to record what they read).

When students return to school in September, they will discuss and complete assignments based on the required reading for their grade level. Reading over the summer should be fun and encompass a variety of books at your child's reading and interest level. Encourage your child to read through different mediums— print books, audiobooks, or ebooks. To make reading enjoyable, your child can read to you, a sibling, or you can snuggle up and read together! We have enclosed a Summer Reading "Choice Board" below, which your child will use as a log for their other FOUR free choice reads. <u>*Choice Boards are due September 5, 2025.*</u>
