Practice writing using chalk, markers and crayons</p>	<p>Draw a picture of a birthday cake and have a grown-up help you write the month and date. Hang it up in your room so you can see it</p>	<p>Practice writing your first name in crayon, marker and with a pencil. Count the number of letters in your first name</p>
<p>Practice identifying colors by playing i spy to point out the different colors of objects!</p>	<p>FREE CHOICE (e.g cut, paste, glue, color a picture in the lines)</p> <p>What did you do: _____</p>	<p>Read daily with your child and identify words that rhyme as well pointing under the words to support left to right</p>
